# I. The cross predicted through King David. *Psalm* 22:1-5

This *Psalm*, written by David is known as the *Psalm of the Cross*; Jesus actually \_\_\_\_\_\_ this *Psalm* which was written hundreds of years prior, while He was on the cross.

#### 1. My God, My God. Psalm 22:1

The title Jesus uses here is the strongest title for God; "*El*" which means "The \_\_\_\_\_ God!" *2 Corinthians 5:21* 

• "Oh that we could imitate this cleaving to an \_\_\_\_\_\_ God!" C.H. Spurgeon

## 2. I cry in the daytime, but You do not hear. Psalm 22:2-3

God's timing is perfect and even though Jesus would have to endure this time of pain, the Father is \_\_\_\_\_\_ working out His eternal plan of salvation.

• The \_\_\_\_\_\_ is proof that Jesus is who He said He is; and His great love for you will last forever.

## 3. Past times of faithfulness. *Psalm 22:4-5*

Faith is \_\_\_\_\_\_ the Lord, especially through the darkest hours of life. *Hebrews 11:1* 

- "I have not lost faith in God. I have moments of anger and protest. Sometimes I've been \_\_\_\_\_\_ to Him for that reason." (Wiesel)
- Never let the timing of a situation or trial change your mind or

\_\_\_\_\_ your faith about God's faithfulness.

## II. Science and faith intersect at the Cross. *Psalm 22:6-8*

Strong's Concordance 8348; (תּוֹלָע), \_\_\_\_\_ [coccus ilicis] means; crimson, purple, or the dye made from the dried body of the female worm.

- 1. At the appointed time from God the Father, Jesus willingly took Calvary's tree to \_\_\_\_\_ His family, the church.
- 2. Jesus is now covering our sin and protecting us for eternity. *Isaiah 54:17, Psalm 32:7*
- 3. Jesus shed His blood and \_\_\_\_\_ all of my sin.

4. Jesus sacrificed His life on a tree so that his children might be washed with His \_\_\_\_\_ (Tola) blood and their sins become white as snow. *Isaiah 1:18* 

## III. Practical Application.
