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I. Potlucks. 1 Corinthians 11:17-18
Some of the issues Paul heard about in Corinth were,
divorce, sexual sins, food offered to idols, the exercise of spiritual gifts in
the church, and the collection for the poor.
<ul> <li>In the early church they had a special time of fellowship that</li> </ul>
happened every week, called the (love) Feast which is
similar to what we call potlucks today.
Some of the wealthier people were not considering those who were in
need when they took too much food. <i>Philippians 2:4</i>
II. Divisions and cliques. 1 Corinthians 11:19-22
Along with divisions, certain church were formed as well,
which should never happen within a body of believers.
1. The of the Bible as originally written.
2. The belief in the Triune Godhead; there is only One God, revealed
in three persons; Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
3. The belief in the birth of Jesus as a man (fully God and
man); although Jesus came as a baby in Bethlehem; He remained
fully God at the same time.
<b>4.</b> The belief that Salvation comes from Jesus; by God's
grace alone, through faith in Christ alone.
5. The belief Jesus died on the, was buried, and bodily
rose on the third day.
III. The Lord's Supper. 1 Corinthians 11:23-25
The first Lord's Supper began the night Jesus was betrayed, as He
was sharing a meal with the Disciples.
"The value of the experience depends on the condition of the of
those who participate; and this was the problem at Corinth." (Wiersbe)
When we take communion, we are remembering the supreme
sacrifice of Christ and the lengths He was willing to go to save God's
and make them children. <b>Romans 5:10</b>
IV. Proclaim Jesus. 1 Corinthians 11:26
"Often we have broken bread together around the Lord's Table, and then
we have gone out to do just what those disciples did – we have
Him." (Redpath)
