I. Down-time with the Lord. Mark 6:30-32
Jesus knew the Disciples needed <i>rest</i> ; but they did not need just <i>any rest</i> ,
they needed <i>rest</i> and with Him! <i>John 5:17</i>
• It is important to seek the Lord's direction in order to get the timing
correct - when to, when to wait, and when to <i>rest</i> .
If you have entered God's <i>rest</i> through the person of Jesus Christ, you
should stop trying to work to God's favor, because you know you
have favor from God by faith in Christ. <i>Ephesians 2:8-9</i>
