I. Ambassadors for Christ. <i>Philippians 1:27</i>
"The Christian life is not a playground, it is a" (Wiersbe)
 The King of Heaven has a message that needs to be delivered, and
Paul said in Christ are to deliver that message as
though God were pleading through them. 2 Corinthians 5:20
Ambassadors are representatives who remember the honor and
reputation of their homeland with their
 The enemy's goal is to divide and conquer the Church. Paul said
his desire was for Christians to be with the essentials
of the faith while their conduct was worthy of the Gospel.
II. Behalf of Christ. Philippians 1:28-30
The Apostle Paul was saying, "Don't panic and remember who you are in
Christ, and more importantly remember that God is in"
 Paul says it has been granted to us on behalf of Christ not only to
believe but to suffer for Him as well. The word <i>granted</i> can be
translated as
Notice the caveat in <i>Matthew 5:10</i> : the <i>blessing</i> is for those who are
persecuted for sake.
III. Like-minded believers. Philippians 2:1-2
The secret to maintaining peace within the body of Christ happens by all of
its members having a focus.
• We should take these rhetorical questions in <i>Philippians 2:1</i> as a
test to see how we are doing as a body of believers.
"To be gospel oriented is to be oriented." (R. Kent Hughes)
IV. Look out for the interests of others. Philippians 2:3-4
As followers of Christ, we must always check the of our
hearts and constantly ask ourselves why we do what we do.
 The way to true joy in the life of a Christian can be explained by
using the acrostic for joy: Jesus, others, and then
Believers are to be in with each other as we are led by the Holy
Spirit's comfort, fellowship, tenderness, compassion, love, and purpose,
while discovering our motivation for our actions.

- 4. Read *Philippians* 1:29-30. What gift did Paul say the Lord gifted to His followers? How do we usually receive this gift?

- 5. Read *Philippians 2:1-2.* What did Rich say "the secret to maintaining peace within the body of Christ" was (point III. of the sermon note sheet)? Discuss the rhetorical questions Paul mentioned in *Philippians 2:1*.
- **6.** Read *Philippians 2:3-4*. Discuss what Paul said about selfish ambition and conceit verses having the lowliness of mind and considering others.
