I. Immaculate Conception. Matthew 1:18
Betrothal was official and binding; similar to a marriage
but had a much deeper importance than our modern-day practice.
 Everyone would expect Joseph to give Mary a letter of divorce,
not for irreconcilable differences, but for supposed

John 8:41 You do the deeds of your father." Then they said to Him,
"We were not born of; we have one Father, God."
II. Joseph was a "just" man. Matthew 1:19
As we read this verse, we start to see the sincere and
faith of Joseph by his immediate response.
• "Just" in Greek refers to a sincere righteousness in the sight of
God; a righteousness that only comes from in
Faith is placing your trust in God which then causes!
III. A change of plans. Matthew 1:20-21
We do not know whether Mary tried to to Joseph that she
was pregnant by the Holy Spirit, but if she had, Joseph did not
immediately believe her but the angel's visit convinced him.
 The baby's mission statement and life purpose were clear; "For
He will His people from their sins".
IV. Fulfillment of prophecy. Matthew 1:22-25
Galatians 3:6 just as Abraham "believed God, and it was
to him for righteousness." NKJV
 One of the greatest sources of true is a
determination to defend what is right and what is true.
V. Practical Application.
Through his courageous obedience and faith in God, a supernatural
surrounded Joseph's life even during turmoil.
1. We see Joseph answering for his life.
Life's greatest adventure begins when we are Christ!
2. We need to hear from the Lord. John 10:27
3. Stay away from worldly 2 Timothy 2:3-4
4. Learn to trust the Lord. <i>Proverbs 3:5-6</i>
Isaiah 26:3 You (God) will keep him in perfect; Whose mind

is stayed on You, because he trusts in You. NKJV
